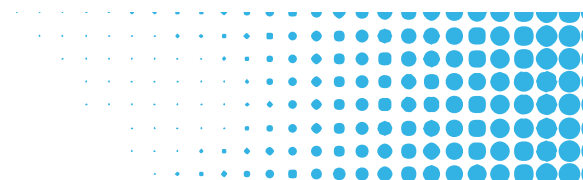

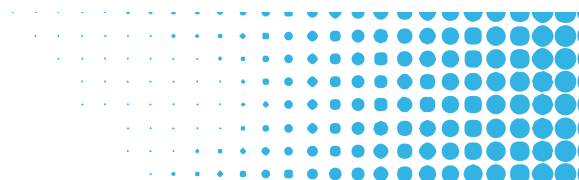



# MOTIONS

## **Motion 3 – Board of Directors**

This motion involves amending one resolution and rescinding 3 others as outlined below:

1. Amend Resolution BOD 2 ('08) from the Resolutions & By Laws:

The operations of the Association be organized by reference to:

- (a) the rules of competition set out in the Competition Rules & Regulations;
- (b) the rules for officiating events as set out in the Field of Play Handbook; and
- (c) the Policies and Guidelines in force from time to time, as published by the Association on its website, without limiting future policies to be developed and adopted

The content of the Field of Play Handbook, the Competition Rules & Regulations and the LAQ Policies be determined by:

- (i) the Board from time to time; and
- (ii) Resolutions passed at Conference (in which case no change may be effected to any such provision without a further motion passed at Conference), subject to the Association Constitution, Resolutions & By-Laws.

To read:

The operations of the Association be organised by reference to:

- (a) the rules of competition set out in the Competition Rules & Regulations;
- (b) the rules for officiating events as set out in the Field of Play Handbook; and
- (c) the Policies and Guidelines in force from time to time, as published by the Association on its website, without limiting future policies to be developed and adopted

The content of all LAQ documents and policies be determined by the Board from time to time. In doing so, the Board may consult with LAQ Committees, Centres and Regions or other stakeholders deemed necessary.

2. Rescind Resolution C1 ('86)

That any competition motion passed by Conference shall not be rescinded within two years unless 80% of those eligible to vote are in favour.

3. Rescind Resolution P3 ('88)

Decisions made at Conference, which affect the general aspect of Competition, excluding changes as specified in Rule 5.1.2 of the Competition Handbook, shall come into effect immediately.

4. Rescind Resolution W5 ('93)

The Association not to adopt any changes to specifications of events or changes to events during the competition season.

### **Reason:**

Due to resolutions passed between 18 and 40 years ago, our sport is unable to act on member suggestions and broader change in a timely, responsive way. Under the current process, a rule change can take over 24 months to implement, which is no longer workable in a rapidly changing sporting environment.

Some recent examples of this include:

- During the Sunday session at the 2026 Conference, relay rules will be discussed. However, even with unanimous support for a change, it cannot be voted in until next year's Conference, for implementation in the 2028 season – over two years from now.
- During the regional forums held earlier this year, there was a clear desire to better align specifications and competition structures with QA/ANQ/schools. While any change will still involve consultation (and no formal proposal has yet occurred), any attempted alignment would take over two years to implement under the current process. That delay risks Queensland becoming out of alignment with other states and misaligned with ALAC and other national events.
- In July, LAA adjusted rules regarding progression in high jump events. LAQ was unable to adopt the change until the new season commenced eight months later.

Making these amendments will mean routine adjustments to rules are no longer made by passing motions at Conference. Instead, feedback will be gathered throughout the year, with a formal call for suggestions at the end of each season. The Board will then determine outcomes having regard to feedback and the advice of staff and appointed expert committees, allowing LAQ to respond faster while still hearing from Centres and Regions.

Constitutional motions will still form part of the Conference as is required under the Act.


## **Motion 4 – Highfields & District**

That section 9.1.4 (iv.) of the LAQ Competition Rules and Regulations 2025 – 2026 (Regulations) and future iterations of the Regulations be amended for more than one timed final events to provide that athletes who qualified for state championships on grass tracks have their seeding times adjusted to reflect the time disadvantage for competing on a grass track rather than a synthetic track, prior to being allocated into timed finals.

### **Reason:**

The current seeding provisions for timed finals at State Championships are not equitable and disadvantage regional athletes and those who have competed in their qualifying championships on a grass track, rather than a synthetic track. The time disadvantage from grass tracks is reflected in the LAQ qualifying performance levels (additional to placegetters) which provide a lower standard for grass rather than synthetic tracks i.e. in u11 boys 800m, the standard is 2.43 for grass and 2.41 for synthetic tracks. Seeding for timed finals should reflect this disadvantage with qualifying times adjusted for this differential prior to athletes being seeded for timed finals.

The Objects of the LAQ Association section 2.1 of the Constitution seek to ensure equity in all aspects of athletics, encourage participation in sport and adopt and amend competition rules in keeping with the terms of the constitution. The current seeding provision for timed finals disadvantage athletes who qualified on grass tracks and limits their ability to race against athletes in their age groups who are at a comparable level. The seeding provisions for timed finals do not provide 'equity in all aspects of athletics' or encourage participation in sport.

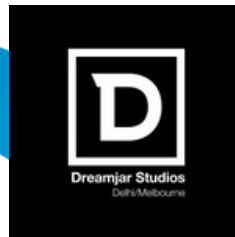

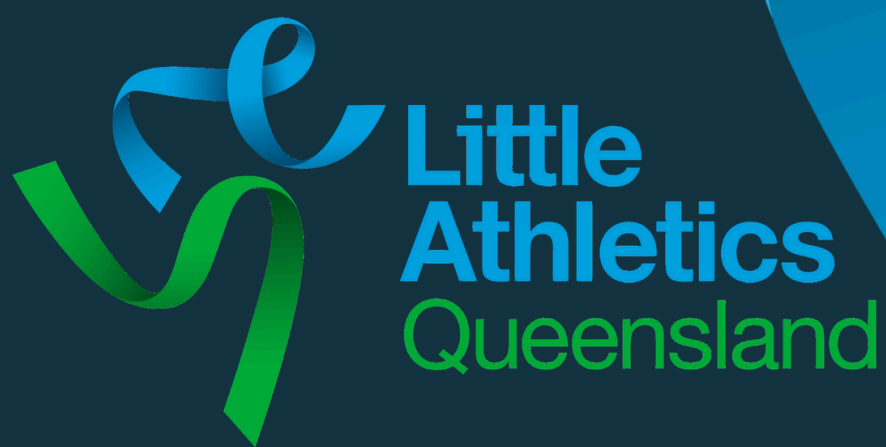
