Registrations

Coaching & Development

....and They're Off....Coaching

Over the last month we have seen a few coaching courses completed for Bargara, North Rockhampton and Townsville Central Centres. Well done to those who participated (and presented), even if there were a couple of very early starts for some!



Introduction to Teaching Little Athletics Skills (ITLAS) – formerly Introduction to Coaching (ITC)

Take your first step into basic athletics skills coaching. All practical, no exam, no previous experience necessary!

If you want to learn more about athletics for kids, then this is the course for you!

The ITLAS is designed to help participants become better placed to assist children to perform basic athletic skills. The course is great for parents, school teachers and other interested persons who want to know a little more about the skills of the sport so that they may help to coach children of Primary school age, assist at Little Athletics Centres or prepare students for a school athletics carnival. Participants will be shown

skills, drills, games and activities relevant to the target age group.

The ITLAS is a non-accredited practical coaching course designed for Little Athletics.

1 Day course - 6.5 hours duration. Cost: **\$99** per participant. Participants need to be minimum of 16 years of age at the time of the course.

Little Athletics Program for Schools (LAPS)

The purpose of our LAPS session is to promote Little Athletics and to encourage more children to register with their local centre. LAQ Development Staff and presenters, on behalf of the local Little Athletics centre make the visits, which include children having an active experience participating in different track and field events and distribution of relevant materials to both teachers and students.

Game of the Month Roosters & Rabbits

Equipment: ground markers

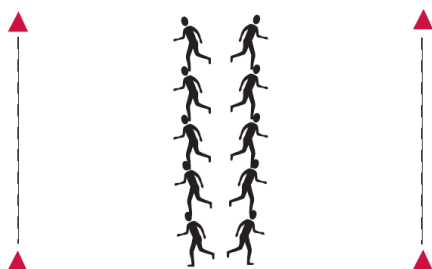
How to play:

Athletes line up beside their partner in two opposing teams, facing away from each other and finger tips touching. One team is named the "Rabbits", the other is named the "Roosters".

The coach will stand at the head of the lines and call "On Your Marks...Set..."and then either "Rabbits" or "Roosters". The team whose name has been called must run to a designated line and the

partner on the opposing team must try to beat them to that line.

Various starting positions such as sitting and lying in a prone position may be used in order to introduce more of an emphasis on agility. The ground markers can be set at any distance, whether the training session is aimed at sprints or distance.

2022 Nordic Sport Australia Winter Regional Championships

Winter Centres that have not already started promoting their local Regional Championships should start doing so to ensure maximum participation.

The competition is open to all U7 – U17 athletes. While the focus should be on maximum participation at Regionals and athletes being their best at these events, it should not be overlooked that this season the 2023 McDonald's State Championships is in the northern Centres' backyard at the Townsville Sports Precinct.

Nomination Details:

- A ResultsHQ Meet Invite will be sent to all Winter Centres at the end of July

- Nominations must be processed through either the Family or Centre ResultsHQ profiles by 9am on the advertised closing dates
- Centres must ensure all registrations are up to date and forward the meet invite for the nomination process to work
- The fee is \$20 per athlete for a maximum of seven events.

Competition Details:

- Any LAQ registered U7 – U17 member is eligible to nominate and participate.
- 1st – 4th placegetter are automatically eligible to nominate for the 2023 McDonald's State Championships

The Department of Tourism, Innovation and Sport [Emerging Athlete Pathways](#) program aims to foster the development of young athletes and officials (such as coaches, referees and scorers), by providing financial assistance to help alleviate the costs associated with attending championship events at a state, national and international level.
